Voters are required to present an **acceptable form of photo ID** in order to vote in person in all Texas elections.

These are the 7 forms of acceptable photo ID:

- 1. Texas driver license issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS)
- 2. Texas Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS
- 3. Texas personal identification card issued by DPS
- 4. Texas license to carry a handgun issued by DPS
- 5. United States military identification card containing the person's photograph
- 6. United States citizenship certificate containing the person's photograph
- 7. United States passport

Voters who do not possess one of the forms of acceptable photo ID, and cannot reasonably obtain one, may present a **supporting form of identification** of the voter and execute a **Reasonable Impediment Declaration**.

These are the 7 forms of supporting ID:

- 1. Valid voter registration certificate
- 2. Certified birth certificate (must be an original)
- 3. Copy of or original current utility bill
- 4. Copy of or original bank statement
- 5. Copy of or original government check
- 6. Copy of or original paycheck
- 7. Copy of or original government document with your name and an address (original required if it contains a photograph)
